April 22nd & 23rd, 2023

SEATTLE, April 3, 2023 – Are you ready for the most culturally enriching festival of the year? This year, Seattleites will have the exciting opportunity to witness children's groups from twenty different countries perform unique dances and musical performances over two days. The festival will also feature cultural exhibits by local ethnic communities, providing an enriching opportunity for visiting children to connect with and learn about each other's cultures. With partnership from Seattle Children's Museum our international playground will once again feature a play structure from Imagination Playground, and Al Hirsch's Games of World will entertain older kids. There will be fun arts & crafts activities, and face painting for kids. The ICFF will also host an Arts Showcase, themed "What Makes You Happy?", that will present a wide range of art forms including paintings, drawings, sculptures, and more. This is a wonderful opportunity for children to explore their creativity and share their unique perspectives on happiness with others. With a diverse lineup of music, art, and cultural displays, the ICFF is sure to offer an unforgettable weekend of learning and fun for families and individuals of all ages.

This year, we are expecting between 3,000-5,000 visitors. ICFF is rapidly gaining popularity in international communities as more countries and regions join the festival each year.
